PASSENGER RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

For your own safety, and the safety of others,

- 1. Before arriving at the airport:
 - a. Give your flight route, destination and schedule to a reliable family member or friend.
 - b. Wear appropriate clothing and sturdy footwear. Dress as if you might have to walk home.
- 2. Before the flight departs:
 - a. Do not pressure the pilot to carry a payload beyond the weight limitations of the aircraft.
 - b. Do not carry hazardous items in your luggage or on your person. If you do not know whether a particular item is safe, ask the pilot.
 - c. Listen to and follow the pilot's pre-flight briefing and instructions. Ask questions if you do not understand.
 - d. Read the passenger briefing card, if provided. If none is provided, be sure you know:
 - i. how to fasten and unfasten your seat belt, and,
 - ii. the location of, and how to open and close, the entry/exit doors near you.
 - e. Know where the fire extinguishers, Emergency Locator Transmitter (ELT), first aid kits and other survival equipment are located and how to use them.
- 3. During the flight:
 - a. Keep your seatbelt and shoulder harness securely fastened at all times.
 - b. Do not distract or disturb the pilot at critical times such as take-off, approach and landing. If you are wearing headphones connected to the pilot's intercom, do not talk when the pilot or someone else is talking on the radio.

4. Any time:

- a. Follow the pilot's instructions, especially in the event of an emergency.
- b. Ask the pilot questions if you are uncomfortable about the weather, aircraft condition or loading, route of flight, or anything else that might affect the safety of the flight.
- c. Do not pressure the pilot to depart or continue a flight when they say the weather is too bad. There is no reason to fly worth risking your life or the lives of others.
- d. Do not approach any aircraft with the engine running unless you are escorted by the pilot or another responsible person, or have been instructed how to do so safely.
- e. Do not engage in horseplay aboard the aircraft, prior to boarding or after deplaning, or at any time near aircraft.
